Earth's Environment: Eucalypt Forest Stage 2 - Geography





Using a variety of teacher and student led activities through the bush, students discover the habitats in the forest, how they meet the needs of living things and how plants are used by animals.

Learning Experiences

The day is started with locating self on a large scale map and creating an animal evidence recording table. Using a small journal throughout the day students participate in numerous activities using observation and creativity as they discover the wonders of a eucalypt forest.





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Outcomes

A student:

Content

Students examine the importance of natural vegetation and natural resources to the environment, animals and people and learn about the ways people value environments including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

Students acquire, process and communicate geographical information.

Students use the following geographical tools: maps, fieldwork, graphs and statistics and visual representations.
